WHAT GUIDES TRiP?

The **focus** of TRiP is “behaviours or conditions that place children in a position of vulnerability”.

TRiP is a shared commitment by multiple human service agencies to improve **client outcomes** through intersectoral collaboration, risk reduction, and coordinated service provisions.

The **goal** of TRiP is to “make appropriate connections and referrals for children to optimize their health, safety and development through improved communication and collaboration among service providers”.

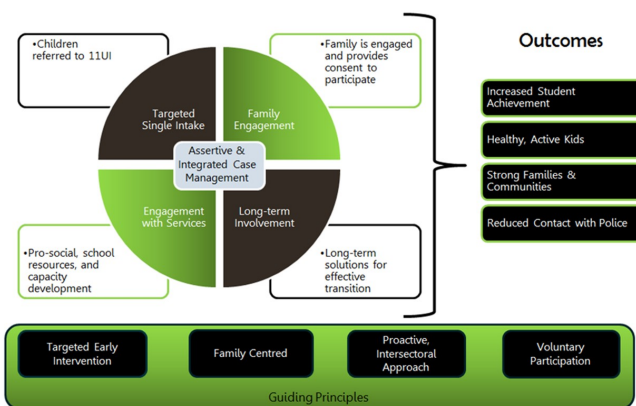
The Regina Intersectoral Partnership (TRiP)

The Regina Intersectoral Partnership (TRiP) is a three-component, multi-sector collaborative risk-driven initiative designed to improve community safety and well-being in Regina, Saskatchewan. These components include the 11 and Under Initiative (11UI), the twelve&up Initiative (twelve&up), and the Hub.

By focusing on coordinated service support, reduction of barriers to pro-social activities, and school engagement, both 11UI and twelve&up aim to generate risk reduction, and ultimately reduced vulnerability of children and their families. The Hub is designed to identify situations of acutely-elevated risk, and rapidly mobilize interventions of support to prevent crises and harm.

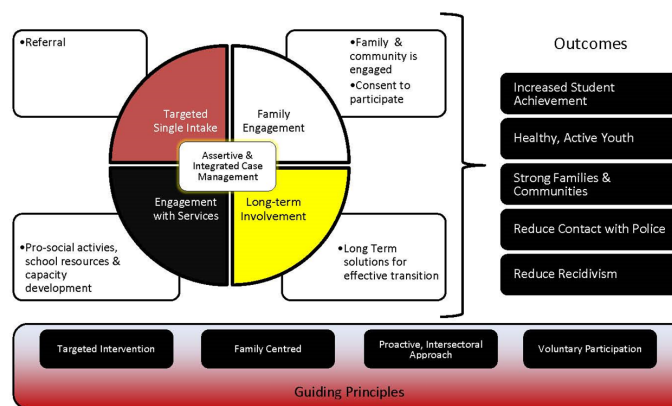
11 and Under Initiative



The 11 and Under Initiative (11UI) is a collaborative partnership aimed at supporting children under the age of 12 who are exhibiting behaviour that puts them at risk for criminal involvement or are at increased risk for victimization. Through early identification of risk factors & targeted intervention, it is hoped that challenges faced by referred children & their families are addressed & that their potential is optimized.

11UI & twelve&up are consent based. They utilize an integrated & assertive case management approach, ensuring that supports are comprehensive & consistent for the child & their family. These 2 components support the strength & resilience of families by increasing awareness & access to existing social supports & services.

twelve&up



The twelve&up Initiative is also a risk intervention model that will function on the same principals & business processes as the 11UI. This component of TRiP focuses on young people aged 12 to 18.

Reducing recidivism has been added as an outcome for this age group.

Hub



The Hub is a discussion between multiple government agencies in the human services delivery taking place twice per week for an hour & a half. It is a discussion & does not have any actual case management role or authority. The case management & the actual service delivery fully remain with the agencies. The Hub discussion focuses on providing immediate coordinated and integrated responses through mobilization of existing resources to address situations facing individuals, families or environments with acutely elevated risk factors, as recognized across a range of service providers.
